The Ulrike Michal Foundation for the Arts (UMFFTA) is a small grant-giving charity endowed by the estate of the late Dr Ulrike Michal which is registered with the Charities Commission, registration number 1188685.

The Ulrike Michal Foundation is committed to protecting your personal information which information is treated in compliance with the provisions of the Data Protection Act 1998 and the General Data Protection Regulation (EU) 2016/679

This privacy notice tells you about the information we collect about you when you visit our website, make a grant application or otherwise provide us with information.

It also tells you how you can exercise your rights including the right to object to some of the data handling we carry out.

1. Privacy Policy

1.1. Why we need your information

We need to collect some personal information to allow us to offer our services to you and to comply with our legal and fiduciary duties. We will only collect the minimum amount of information necessary to provide a service to you, or comply with our legal responsibilities.

Personal information may be collected and processed for the following purposes:-

Grant Applications

You may have to include personal information within an application submitted to us. If so, you are responsible for confirming you have the agreement and permissions of any individuals identified in your application, to pass their information to the Ulrike Michal Foundation. We will only use this information for the purposes of assessing your application, managing or monitoring any grant awarded, and related administration or research purposes. We occasionally contact grant applicants in order to improve our procedures. Participation in surveys is voluntary, and you are under no obligation to answer any questions or reply to any survey you might receive from us. Should you choose to do so, we will treat the information you provide with the same high standard of care as all other personal information.

We may also contact you in relation to something separate to your application but for a reason we believe to be in the legitimate interest to you and/or your organisation.

1.2 How we process your information

We will only use your personal information for the purpose it was given, we will not keep it for longer than is necessary at which point your information will be destroyed securely. Information provided through a grant application, may be retained for application monitoring, grant monitoring, archiving and legal purposes for up to 6 years as per the declaration in the initial grant application form.

As soon as we have no 'legitimate interest' in keeping any personal information, it will be deleted from our archives.

Your personal information will not be shared with a third party unless you have previously been informed and given express consent i.e. on an application form, or it is required by law, such as with the HMRC or with the police for the detection or prevention of crime.

2. Cookie Policy

A cookie is a small file which asks permission to be placed on your computer's hard drive. Once you agree, the file is added and the cookie helps analyse web traffic or lets you know when you visit a particular site.
